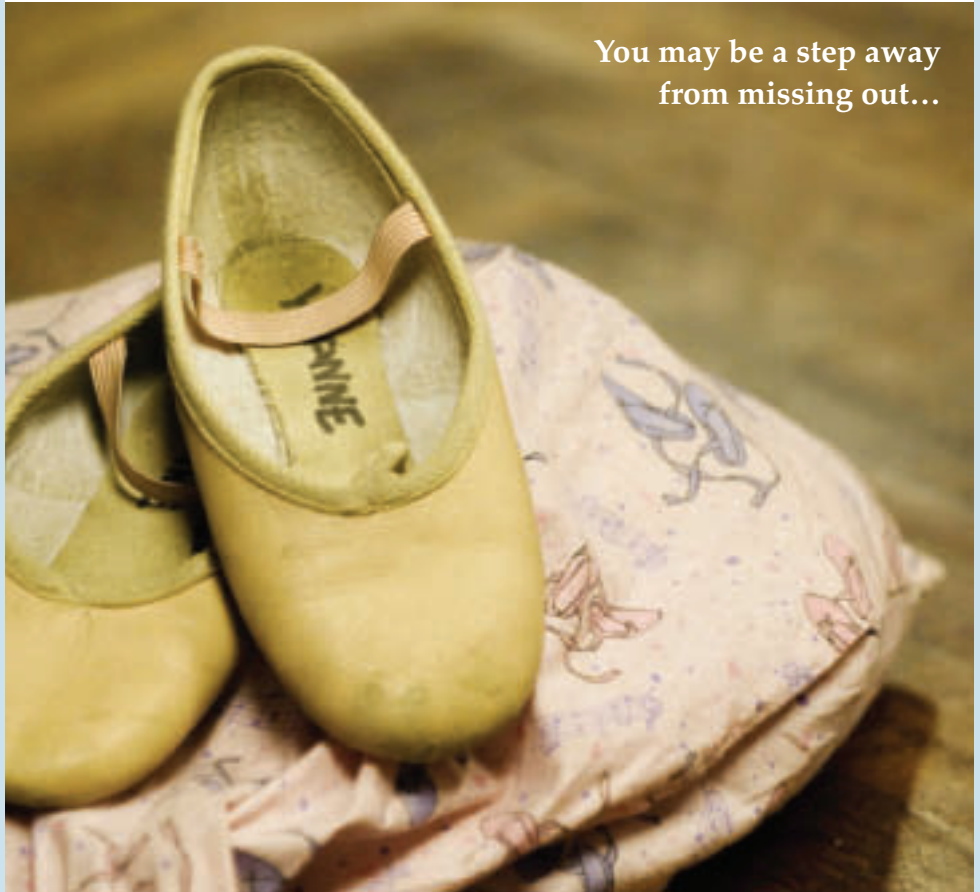




Getting to the Tops

Girls develop enormously between the ages of 7 and 11.

Please read this leaflet to understand the reasons why you should allow your daughter to reach the top of the school at Bramley and benefit from this unique opportunity.

It is in the Prep part of the school (ages 7 to 11) that your daughter will really benefit from being taught by Subject Specialist Teachers who nurture and inspire right up to Common Entrance and senior school examinations. Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning are also taught from seven years of age. With parents, teachers work hard to secure the senior school of their first choice – a success that we are particularly proud of.
